JLA Major Trauma

We are delighted to announce that the Major Trauma Priority Setting Partnership (PSP) Top 10 was published in October 2023! Check out the final 10 here <https://shorturl.at/D3579>

This International PSP worked with patients, carers, and clinicians to identify uncertainties about the treatment and rehabilitation of patients suffering major trauma.

ACCoRD Adhesive Capsulitis Corticosteroid or Dilation

ACCoRD a first of its kind study, looking at if we can treat frozen shoulder in primary care (i.e. without needing to see an orthopaedic surgeon). The study was led by physiotherapists and we are thrilled to achieve 80% of our recruitment target (54 participants).

The Bone & Joint Health research team recruited a fantastic 47 participants in 6 months! The study is now in follow up, watch this space for results!

TiLLI Thromboprophylaxis in Lower Limb Immobilisation

Thromboembolism in Lower Limb Injury (TiLLI) is our new clinical trial that will look at what the best method of preventing blood clots forming in people who have had a cast or brace put on their leg due to an injury. We will open TiLLI at 30 hospitals across the UK and recruit over 10,000 people, starting in May 2024.
